POMPANO BASEBALL!

May 2016



The Pompano Beach Municipal Stadium was opened March 22, 1957 and was home to the Pompano Beach Cubs. It also was the spring training home of the Washington Senators, from 1961 to 1971 and Texas Rangers from 1972 to 1986. Some of the notable players from this time are 1st baseman John Milner, future Mets/ Braves reliefs Danny Friscelli and Buzz Capra. Texas Rangers left Pompano in April 1986.

The stadium was last used for professional baseball in 1999. Between hurricanes and lack of use the buildings and field deteriorated and were demolished in 2008 for the new Baseball complex .

IN REMEMBRANCE



E.L. "BUD' GARNER

January 16, 1927 - April 21, 2016 Edward Lee (Bud) Garner was born Jan. 16, 1927 in Alabama. He was the 2nd of 4 children

born to J.E. and Dausia Garner. In order for his father to take a job with the Florida East Coast Railroad, they moved to Pompano when Bud was 9 months old. He lived in Pompano his whole life, except for the time he spent in the US Navy. He and his wife Doris are Pioneers of Broward County and Bud is the Historian of the City of Pompano Beach. He has been active in the Historical Society of Pompano Beach and The Hillsboro Lighthouse Preservation Society. In his retirement, he became a prolific writer, telling stories of growing up in Pompano and documenting the history of the area in his own words and through his own eyes. Those stories have been published in several books over the years. Bud joined the US Navy at the age of 16 in 1943. He served both in the Atlantic and the Pacific, spending time on the USS Niblack. He was very proud to have served his country in WWII. He returned home in 1945 where he went back to Pompano High School and graduated in 1948. (Go Beanpickers!) He married his high school sweetheart, Doris Evelyn Corbett on May 22, 1949. They would have celebrated their 67th Wedding Anniversary in a few weeks. Bud is survived by his wife, Doris, his brother Jim Garner and his two sisters Rose Chambers and Alice Mainguy. He and Doris have 4 children, 8 grandchildren and 11 great grandchildren. Bud was an active member of his church, First Baptist Church of Pompano Beach. He and Doris were married in that church. They became founding members of the church plant, North Pompano Baptist Church, where he served as a deacon for many years. Bud passed away suddenly on April 21, 2016 after a brief illness.
